Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This weekend we observe the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, a liturgical feast which celebrates the central mystery of the Christian faith. Belief in the trinity distinguishes Christians from adherents to all other world religions. Hinduism is pantheistic, Buddhism agnostic. Islam and Judaism hold to monopersonal monotheism. Jews consider the Trinity erroneous, and Muslims find it offensive.

Although the truth of the trinity cannot be demonstrated and must be accepted by faith in God's revelation of himself, nonetheless, meditation on the nature of love lends credibility to this act of faith.

The readings for this solemnity focus on the name and attributes of God. When we talk about the name of God, we need to remember that in the Biblical worldview, the names of things are very important. The name expresses the essence of a person or thing. Especially in the Old Testament, to speak of a person's name is tantamount to speaking of their very nature.

How can we grow in our understanding and experience of God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit? It is the Holy Spirit who reveals the Father and the Son to us and who gives us the gift of faith to know and understand the truth of God's word. Through baptism we receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Lord renews the gift of the Spirit in each one of us as we open our hearts with expectant faith and yield to his work in our lives. Jesus promised his disciples that he would send them the Spirit of truth who would be their Teacher and Guide. Ask the Lord Jesus to renew in you the gift of the Holy Spirit who strengthens us in the seven-fold gifts of wisdom and understanding, right judgment and courage, knowledge and reverence, and holy fear in God's presence (Isaiah 11:2-3).
